UNITED STATES VIRGIN ISLANDS

ST. THOMAS

Adorned with jungle-clad cliffs and oceans teeming with parrotfish, with cream-colored sails dotting the blue horizon, St. Thomas captures the spirit of the U.S. Virgin Islands. Golf lovers can book a tee time on the greens of the Mahogany Run Golf Course, a par-70 course specially curated and designed by Tom and George Fazio. If you'd prefer to spend time resting on soft white sands, Water Island and its Honeymoon Beach are a stone's throw away.



MAGENS BAY

This mirror-like bay is where warm waters, crystal-clear visibility, and perfect snorkeling conditions come standard. Cruise to Magens Beach, awarded by Conde Nast and National Geographic as one of the most revered beaches in the world. Sands reach around the romantic heart-shaped bay, inviting you to drop anchor and plunge into the tropical shades of blue on a snorkeling adventure. Or, you can keep the adventure above the ocean's surface — absorbing green mountain views while cruising the bay on paddleboards and kayaks.



ST. JOHN

Without a cruise ship or chain store in sight, St. John is celebrated as one of the natural wonders of the U.S. Virgin Islands. The emerald-green island is a wealth of fairytale forests, snow-white sands, and signature bays and beaches scattered with sleepy turtles and colorful coral. Bright little bays, collected cays, and sugar mill ruins adorn the dreamy landscape.



FRANCIS BAY

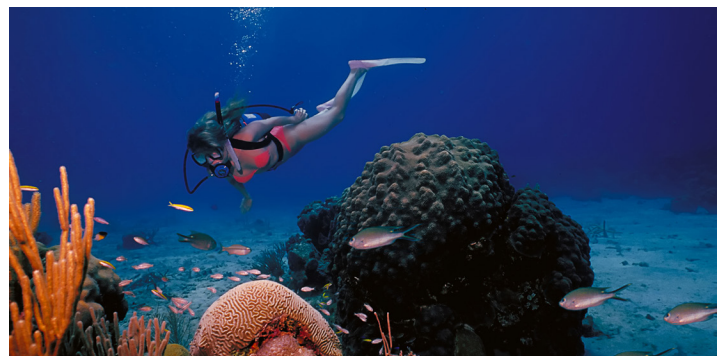
Francis Bay sits off the beaten track, meaning you can drop anchor without jostling the crowd to get a spot onshore. A highlight of landing on Francis Bay is the kayaking; paddle out around Whistling Cay with its narrow cliff-cut passage, or snorkel above swaying seagrass, Zen-like manta rays, and bright blue tangs. Or stretch your legs on the Francis Bay Trail, cutting through salt-laden marshes and cool, dry shrub.

CRUZ BAY

Discover a different side to St. John as your yacht sets sail for the spring break synergy of Cruz Bay. A one-stop shop for island life, hit up the numerous cantinas and beach bars to sip cocktails with the sailors, or head deep into the flora-clad delights of the national park.

Cruz Bay National Park makes for a more than worthwhile safari. Ask your captain to arrange a private guided Jeep tour to explore a little more of St. John's inland grace and glory. An off-road tour will take you to see secret thundering waterfalls, luscious lookout points, and the island's showcase flora and fauna.

The famed Mongoose Junction is a must for anyone swinging by Cruz Bay. This spirited dining and shopping hub is well loved for its charming courtyards, fine art for sale, island-made jewelry, and gorgeous galleries. Those wanting to experience dinner on land will find plenty of laid-back restaurants and craft brews on tap inside the junction.





ST. CROIX

Double the size of St. Thomas, this lush hotspot is a veritable treasure chest of mountains, plains, and shadowy, fantasy-like forests. With fewer tourists, St. Croix is perfect for a local taste of rum, fishing, and exploring.

And when it comes to exciting late-night adventures, St. Croix has you covered. From rolling dice at the casino and imbibing rum cocktails to putting on your dancing shoes, this is the island where people like to party. Those who prefer quieter nights can opt for an evening cruise around the island, enjoying pink-tinged sunsets over paradise.



CHRISTIANSTED

One of the liveliest towns in all the Virgin Islands, Christiansted strikes a balance between bright and breezy, eager and easy. Take a historic tour of Fort Christiansted or Fort Frederik to learn about the island's swashbuckling past. For more wildlife wonders, head to the Sandy Point National Wildlife Refuge to admire leatherback turtles nesting on soft sands.

BUCK ISLAND

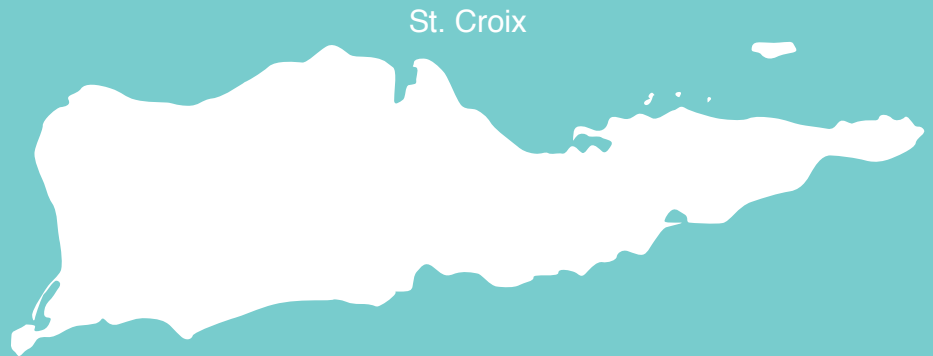
Six acres make up this sterling national park, where the land is rich in wildlife and the waters brim with fish, turtles, and other elegant underwater creatures. The nearby Turtle Beach is a must-stop spot for those who want to squeeze in an amazing snorkeling session in the USVI. Divers will delight at the Buck Island Reef National Monument, with its sandy ocean floor and sculpted coral castles.

Linger on the shores of Buck Island, or enjoy a canapés-and-champagne kind of afternoon. Then climb back onboard, and turn course toward the St. Croix Yacht Club. The stunning manicured grounds are perfect for a stroll with a glass of fizz in hand.
